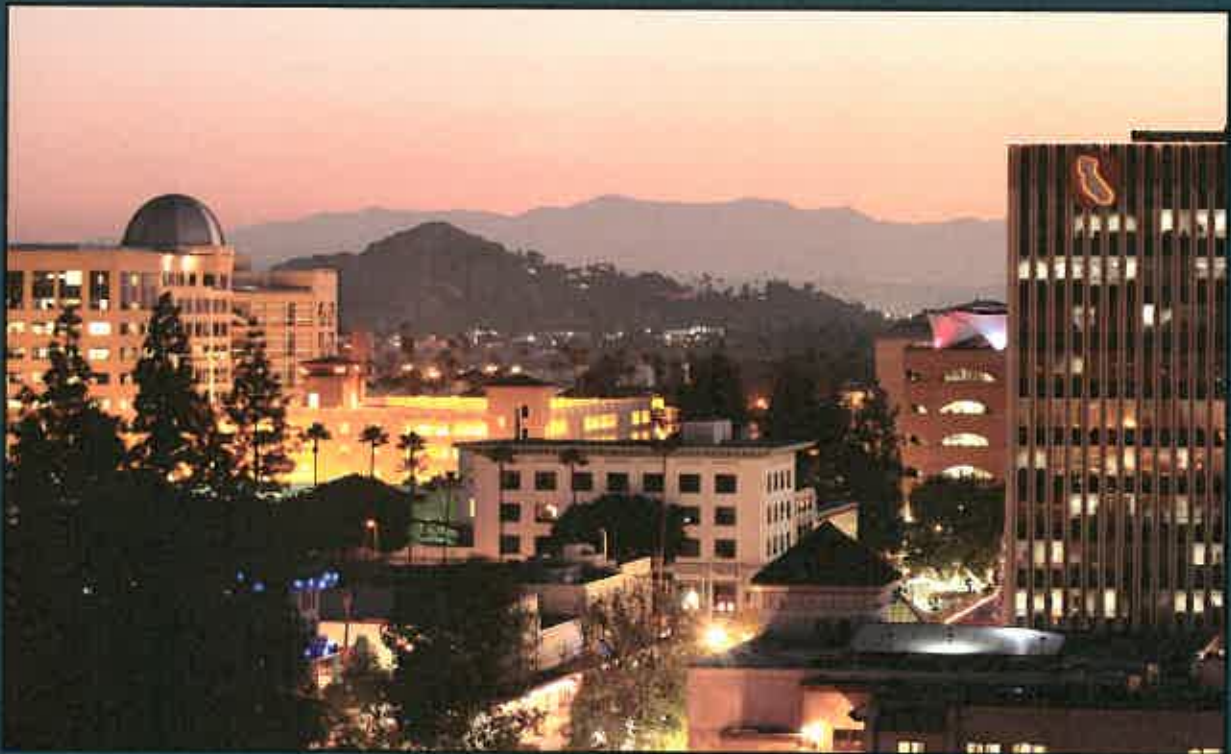

JJDPC Annual Report FY 2019-2020

Introduction

The Riverside County JJDPC is a statutorily mandated group of private citizens who perform a variety of advocacy and regulatory functions on behalf of the youth involved in the juvenile justice system. JJDPC is empowered by the California Welfare and Institutions Code (WIC) Sections 22-231 to “inquire into the administration of juvenile court law.” JJDPC develops an action plan and is proactive in meeting its goals and responsibilities throughout the year.

Mission Statement

The Mission of the Riverside County Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Commission is to inquire into the administration of juvenile court law and to ensure that the highest standards of care and services are maintained for the youth within the juvenile justice system.

Functions and Responsibilities

The Commissioners meet monthly to keep informed of current youth programs within the county, report on community events and track relevant legislation such as SB462 (Juvenile Case Files), AB403 (Group Homes) and AB1730 (Human Trafficking: minors). The Commissioners conduct inspections of law enforcement facilities (Lock-Ups) that temporarily house minors; juvenile detention facilities, including Youth Treatment and Education Center (YTEC) and Group Homes.

Appointment of Commissioners

Commissioners are appointed by the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court with the concurrence of the Presiding Judge of the Juvenile Court to serve up to two, four-year terms. After term completion, the commission may choose to extend a commission service term on an annual basis. The recruitment of new Commissioners is an ongoing process and an active applicant list is maintained. The Commission may have no more than 15 members with two of the positions designated for youth members between the ages of 14 and 21. JJDPC continues to seek youth who are able to serve on the Commission. There are currently ten members of the Commission.

Budget

The commission submitted the budget proposal for FY 2019/2020 to Chief Probation Officer Mark A. Hake for review. Chief Hake approved the proposed budget.

▪ **Youth Legislation and Group Home AB403 issues**

Achieved: The commission discusses new youth related legislation at monthly meetings. Foster Care and Group Homes continue to be a main point of concern for the commission due to AB403: Continuum of Care Reform and Group Homes transitioning to Short-Term Residential Treatment Program (STRTP) status. DPSS representative, Bridgette Hernandez attends our monthly meetings as available to share the latest information re Foster Care.

▪ **Resources: Continue to identify local programs for 'at risk' youth**

Achieved: New youth programs are continuously sought by the commission. At our Quarterly Meetings, RSO, RPD, DA, Probation and others, report out on how local youth programs are progressing and evolving.

Periodically, JJDPCC support secretary Elizabeth Martinez-Leon receives phone calls from the public who are seeking youth programs for their child, usually teenagers. She is able to provide information and options specific to their needs from local resources.

▪ **Recruitment: Continue efforts to fill commission vacancies**

Achieved: Kelly Curtis was appointed to the commission on 07/31/19. Christopher Collopy was appointed to the commission on 11/22/19. While there were no other new members appointed during this reporting period, our recruitment efforts have not changed.

▪ **Seek training opportunities (BSCC, State and Local agencies)**

Achieved: On August 8, 2019, 1 JJDPC member attended the Annual CPPCA Training Conference Lake Tahoe, CA. The Commissioner returned with valuable information.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF JANUARY 13, 2020 MEETING:

PROGRAM UPDATE

TATTOO REMOVAL

LATOYA THOMAS, ASSISTANT DIVISION DIRECTOR, RIVERSIDE COUNTY PROBATION

LaToya Thomas provided an update on the efforts to expand services. Unfortunately, numbers have not increased as we hoped. Currently, three youth are in the program. They all are utilizing services out of the Riverside region. In October 2019, the program was expanded to include youth/clients in Riverside County, up to the age of 21. However, anticipated numbers have not been observed. Yet, inquiries have been received from a variety of different entities, particularly for adults, and the Probation Department is connecting them with services.

VICTIM MEDIATION: RESTORATIVE JUSTICE - PROBATION

Restorative Justice is a program where youth who committed low level offenses are directly connected to the victim for mediation services to facilitate understanding of victim impact. However, the program is on hold while the Probation Department is making some modifications to bring this program current.

TECHNICAL REPORT BY WestEd

Staci Wendt, Director of the JJCPA evaluation, presented the 2019 Evaluation Report.

The committee was provided with the Evaluation of Riverside County Probation Department's Juvenile Justice Crime Prevention Act Programs – 2019 Evaluation Report and a two-page summary of report.

The evaluation primarily focused on the number of youths served. Overall, improvements in school attendance, increases in GPA, decreases in suspension and expulsion, and improvements in youth behavior were noted. In 2020, WestEd will work to reduce duplication in counts, along with identifying specific outcome data for all programs to help increase the rigor of evaluation activities so that more definitive information is known about the specific impact these programs make in the youths' lives.

They thanked all partners for collaborating with them on getting data to them to produce the report.

Estimated JJCPA funding for Riverside County for FY 20/21 will be around \$6.5 million, consistent with prior fiscal years. However, growth funding is also anticipated in an amount estimated to be just under \$4 million. Additionally, in November 2019, the JJCPA approved a contingency fund balance of \$1.16 million, which remains held in reserves, but available for use in FY 20/21. Furthermore, there is an estimated \$4.7 million in unspent JJCPA monies that will be rolled over into FY 20/21. Therefore, the overall estimated dollar amount for next fiscal year is just over \$16.4 million.
